Dear Friends of East West InterKnit,

I trust that your Christmas season was very happy, blessed, and joy filled as you celebrated the birth of the Savior, who is Christ the Lord. I also bring greetings and best wishes from our overseas partners who join with us to express our thanks for your active participation in their ministries through your prayers, your words of encouragement, and your financial gifts in support of the work to which they have been called. Lives in Haiti, Africa, Asia and India have been impacted for eternity by your loving and faithful support during 2025 which allowed East West InterKnit to send resources to assist our partners not merely to overcome difficulties but even to expand the reach of their ministries.

During this season we have been reminded again of God's great love for us in sending his Son to be the savior of the world. We rejoice that in knowing Him we can experience his love, joy, peace and assurance of eternal life. Many though have still not heard the gospel message. We are so grateful for your part in assisting our partners in their work of sharing the good news and of meeting the needs of many who otherwise might never hear of God's love for them.

In the past year our partners' ministries weathered challenges brought by floods, hurricanes, an influx of refugees, political violence, and religious persecution. Nevertheless, they report that even when things seemed most difficult God provided just what was needed.

Our Haiti partner recently shared some highlights from their ministry during 2025 and reflected that despite economic hardship, political instability, and increasing social pressures, God is still moving in Haiti.

The school at Plaine du Nord, which receives nearly 75% of its support from East West InterKnit, continues to grow, and now serves about 400 students in grades K-12. They successfully opened a new preschool in October which provides 20 toddlers early childhood education. All school students participate in a home-based vegetable gardening project, which teaches lifelong skills as well as providing an improved diet and an income for the family. Because teachers are being paid, the school can use funds to provide tuition assistance for needy families. The school has also expanded its devotional program to include weekly worship and Bible study. Toward the end of the year, three high school students committed their lives to Christ.

Although civil unrest in Haiti has wreaked havoc on its people, it has not prevented the Mission Evangelique du Nord d'Haiti churches from serving their communities. They were extremely busy throughout the year holding weekly prayer services, discipleship training, women's ministries, men's ministries, and youth events. All this activity has resulted in 210 new converts deciding to follow Christ with 420 baptisms celebrated during the year.

We have received similar reports from our other partners illustrating ways in which God continues to move and provide which we are eager to share with you in upcoming newsletters. Widows and orphans, lepers and other disabled, hundreds of school children, and many others have heard the Good News of the Gospel, many responded, and lives are being changed. Thank you for choosing to join East West InterKnit in our mission of "serving those who serve."
